

# Exchange possibilities

# There are three ways in which you can spend a semester abroad while enrolled at the BFH:

	Swiss European Mobility Programme SEMP (former Erasmus)	Bilateral agreements	Free mover

# **FAQs**

### When should I go?

We recommend you go abroad during your 4th or 5th semester. During semester 6 your workload will be high (thesis) and you won't probably be able to make the most out of your experience abroad.

## How long should I go?

You can go abroad for one or two semesters.

## How much should I pay?

As part of the Swiss-European Mobility program, students are eligible for a grant of CHF 1600 per semester. The grants are limited to two semesters.

## How far ahead should I start planning?

Students are encouraged to discuss the possibilities of going abroad with the international advisor a good six to eight months in advance. See the examples below:

#### Where do I start?

- Check the list of partner universities for the program bfh.moveon4.de/publisher/1/eng#
- Get a counseling interview with our International Advisor (international-wing@bfh.ch) to answer questions about the application procedure, module selection, and so on.
- Submit an online application through the MoveOn platform within the deadlines (deadline for autumn semester: CW 2 and for spring semester: CW 32)
- Confirm your nomination at the selected partner university and receive information about the details of becoming an exchange student abroad (application, housing, course registration).

# Other international opportunities

### 6 Swiss-Chinese Summer School in Technology

The BFH together with the College of New Materials and New Energies of the Shenzhen Technology University (SZTU) in China organize every year a four-week Summer School open to all bachelor students. Registration closes every December and upon completion of the program, the student is awarded 4 ECTS points towards the ordinary study programme.


